

A Good Time to Say Thank You!

We had originally planned on opening with another article on how MHARF still receives more inquiries about surrendering horses every month than we do about adopting them. We were going to write about how we really need people to step up to help deal with the number of horses who need homes by adopting from their lo-





cal equine rescues. We were going to list the ways in which owners can take responsibility for the horses they can no longer (or no longer want to) keep. But writing another article like that became seriously depressing. So we decided to write a different one—one celebrating the people who have adopted horses from MHARF, our foster care providers, trainers, volunteers, and our generous donors.

The first thing we want to say is THANK YOU. Thank you to our adopters for knowing

that each horse is an individual & that when you adopt a horse it isn't like picking a car out of a show room. You don't just pick the make, model and color you like and ride off into the sunset. Thank you for understanding that you need to spend time getting to know and trust each other. Your first rides may not have been perfect. You may have even

had to send the horse for additional training or you had to take more lessons yourself. But you made a commitment to that horse and did what you needed to do to make it work. We often hear from people that after the initial "adjustment" period, their rescue horse quickly became the best horse they ever owned. Thank you also for knowing that we put a lot of care into the horses in our program & that the adoption fee you pay helps us cover expenses including all necessary veterinary & farrier care (when you adopt a horse from MHARF you will never get "surprised" with a mare you didn't know was pregnant or a gelding who is actually a stud with an undescended testicle...). And thank you for understanding that our adoption requirements are in place for the safety of the horses, which is our #1 priority. You don't have to have a fancy facility to qualify as an adoptive home—but you do have to have a safe one.

Thank you to our foster providers who are an integral part of our operation. Thank you for being willing to care for a homeless horse until it is lucky enough to find a human of its own. We know it isn't always easy to have another mouth to feed & another stall to clean...but the difference it makes in the amount of good we can do is enormous. Our foster providers not only allow us to move horses who have gone through the rehabilitation process off of the main farm to make room for those coming in, they also provide much needed opportunities for these horses—kind and consistent handling, training, socialization, pasture turnout for grazing and exercising. All of this goes a long way in helping these horses become adoptable and we couldn't do it without our foster care providers.

Thank you to the trainers who help us in our mission to give every horse a chance. Training is the best way to make a horse adoptable. Your knowledge and assistance in assessment, ongoing training, and working with potential adopters is invaluable. This also includes our Trainer's Challenge and Promise of the Future trainers. MHARF Holds 10th Annual Trainer's Challenge of the Unwanted Horse on Sept.16th!

On Saturday, September 16th, MHARF will be celebrating the 10th Anniversary of the Trainer's Challenge of the Unwanted Horse at the Leatherdale Equine Center on the U of M St. Paul campus. The Challenge is our largest fundraiser & adoption event of the year. There are many reasons for the success of this event, but the biggest one is the dedication of the trainers who apply for this 150-day volunteer commitment! One thing we have learned in the twenty-three years since the founding of MHARF is that a solid foundation in training is the most important factor ensuring a horse doesn't end up in a situation where it is "unwanted". Many of the equines we take in are untrained, and in some cases they are entirely unhandled or dealing with trust issues from previous improper handling. In order to make these equines more adoptable we need to provide training. By holding the Challenge and having volunteer trainers compete for prize money we are able to more than quadruple the funds we have available for training! What makes this event even better and allows us to stretch our yearly training budget further? The majority of the prize money is donated by event sponsors!

That brings us to the second reason for the success of the Challenge: our generous sponsors! This year MHARF is thrilled to welcome back Hay Chix as our \$5,000 Grand Championship Sponsor. Young Horses Compete in Promise of the Future Training Competition

In late June 2017 MHARF took in seven donkeys that had been seized by the Animal Humane Society of MN in a Pine County humane case. The donkeys were emaciated, infested with lice, and several had the longest curled hooves we have seen in a case. They were taken to Anoka Equine Veterinary Services at intake where their hooves were de-bulked. Sadly we did have to euthanize one before discharge due to extreme chronic osteomyletis. Two weeks later we had to euthanize a second due to hoof wall separation from severe abscesses. The remaining five are doing well. Two have moved to a foster home where they will be adopted once the humane case is complete. The other three will be available to foster soon. They are all considered "special needs" due to the fact that they will need ongoing specialized farrier care to return their hooves to somewhat normal condition. As of now the case is still pending and we will post details on our website as we have them. In the meantime, please consider making a donation to MHARF to help us care for these very sweet donkeys!
